From Classic Rock to Current Pop, Line Dances to Upbeat Dance music. Plus we will play some slow love songs old and new mixed in to get close to your loved one. There is usually a Garter / Bouquet Toss and Dollar Dance and some Event Dances / Slides. This is a Traditional Wedding Dance.
2. A Wedding Country Dance is similar to Traditional but more Country music and less Urban / Club Music.
3. A Urban / Club Wedding Dance, has less of the traditional wedding event dances and songs and more Urban / Club music.
